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## Faucette House Kitchen Reveal

Thanks to generous funding from a Spartanburg County Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Broad River Electric Coop, the Spartanburg County Foundation, and Michael and Gisele Hastings, the long-awaited kitchen renovation of our Faucette House program is complete and functional as of August. The dream for this new space began in 2018 when conversations with staff highlighted the operational problems in the closed-off, inefficient, and tired kitchen and dining space. The previous kitchen update had taken place over 20 years prior. McMillan Pazdan Smith Architecture designed the new

space, and Dunbar Construction Company, Inc. completed the construction.

The innovative space captures the adage, "The kitchen is the heart of the home." It is lovely, bright, and open to the dining area and living spaces in the rest of the home. Faucette House primarily serves teens in DSS custody, all of whom are actively working toward high school degree completion. Like many families, youth and staff enjoy gathering together at the end of the day to discuss the day's events, play a game, or work through homework problems. In addition, the breakfast bar is a great spot to share an early morning tea while keeping an eye on biscuits in the oven.

A priority for Hope Center for Children's residential programs is to provide as home-like an environment as possible. Keeping in mind that every youth we

serve is with us because they have experienced abuse or neglect, family teachers and our program supervisors do their best to address each child's individual needs. They work tirelessly to infuse daily life with an environment where youth can express ideas and feelings creatively. For example, the Faucette House Supervisor, Taylor Thompson, recently shared, "The residents love the kitchen. It's spacious and gives a home-like feel! One of our residents stated recently, 'Finally, a big kitchen for some good ole soul food!'."

Additionally, a component of the evidencebased Teaching-Family Model used in our residential programs is to work with youth to set goals and build up their repertoire of life skills. These skills include learning to cook, manage finances and a home, and personal care, all of which will help them move toward successful, self-sufficient futures. This kitchen space goes beyond

providing essential, basic meals. It engages each resident in the processes of building healthy relationships with peers and adults, learning food preparation and healthy eating habits, and providing a comfortable and welcoming space to process and move toward healing. Soul food, indeed.

## **Building Her Life**

\*Sara, a former resident of Hope Center for Children's Transitional Living Program (TLP), is a mother of a twoyear-old girl and the first in her family to graduate high school. Her mother, father, and older sisters all dropped out of high school at different points; Sara assumed that she would do the same until she had her daughter. Sara wanted to care for her daughter and provide for her in ways that she'd never had, but she couldn't get the support she needed at home to complete school and manage to parent her daughter. So Sara left home and ended up at TLP, where staff was able to help Sara

apply for vouchers to cover child care while she completed her classes and find academic support to bring up her grades.

Sara graduated in May and is now working full-time while planning her post-graduate studies. While at TLP, she worked to get her driver's



license and saved enough to purchase a car, allowing her to get a better job to build her savings. She is currently applying to local colleges and hopes to stay in the area where she has built a supportive community and established a stable life for her and her daughter. TLP has helped Sara to build confidence, life skills, and consistent routines that will help her to continue to succeed and thrive.
