Jackson's Journey

Jackson had a difficult childhood, beginning with birth parents whose poor decisions led to addiction, prison, and the inability to care for him. He lived with his grandmother for a few years, and when she unexpectedly passed away, Jackson entered the foster care system at 9 years old, moving from home to home. At age 11, Jackson was adopted by a family, but the father became verbally and mentally abusive. After running away from that situation several times, Jackson stayed at the Department of Juvenile Justice for a few months before being placed at Hope Center for

Children.

While at HCFC, Jackson made friends with some of the other boys and was introduced to their mentor, Todd Forringer. "I knew right away that Jackson was a good kid," says Todd. He became a mentor for Jackson as well, including him on fun outings, church services, and holidays. After



meeting Jackson and spending some time with him, Todd's wife Andrea said, "To know Jackson was to love him. He never met a stranger. If you met him one time, he would consider you a friend." Soon after, the Forringer family made the decision to foster Jackson, and pursue adoption. When they told him, he was so happy that he just wanted to hug them. Jackson came home with them, and finally found the family he always dreamed of. After many hurdles and with much perseverance, Jackson's adoption was finalized one month before his 18th birthday and he got to graduate with his new family name.

During all of his time in foster care, Jackson developed resilience and determination. From a very young age he knew that he wanted to join the Marines and help people. This desire did not lessen over time, and he was determined to join as soon as he graduated from high school. Todd and Andrea knew that he had all the qualities that would make him an excellent Marine, like determination, grit, and loyalty, and supported him in his dream to join the military. Sadly, after two years of living his dream, Jackson lost his life in a deployment training accident.

To honor Jackson, his family created a charitable initiative called Jackson's Gift to reward youth aging out of the foster care system and entering a branch of the United States Armed Forces. providing the support, resources and assistance they need to succeed.
