# PREVENTION OUTCOMES

## COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAMS

**95%** of parents who completed services in Triple P (Positive Parenting Program) reported they no longer lose control, and **95%** reported knowing how to handle difficult problems.

**100%** of families who completed services in our Family-Centered Community Support Services (FCCSS) program reduced risk factors that lead to child maltreatment.

**100%** of clients in our Clinical Support Services were able to understand the implications of their trauma and clinical issues.



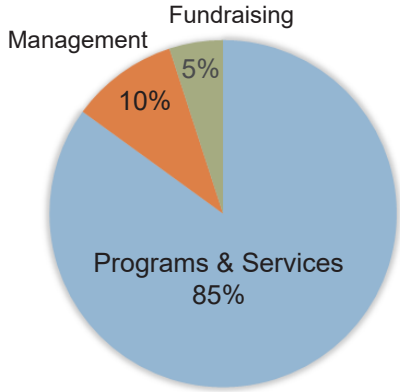
# RESIDENTIAL OUTCOMES

**100%** of youth in our Faucette House program were safe, attended school regularly, and visited regularly with appropriate family.

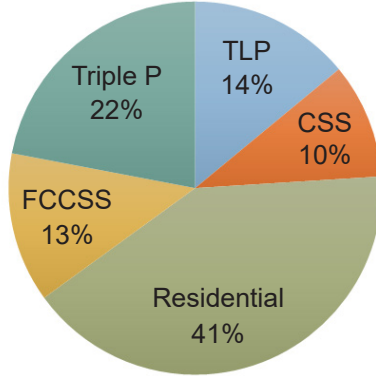
**100%** of youth in our Anchor House program attended school regularly and showed an improvement in life skills.

**100%** of youth in our Transitional Living program improved their life skills, were connected to a primary care doctor, and had safe housing at discharge.

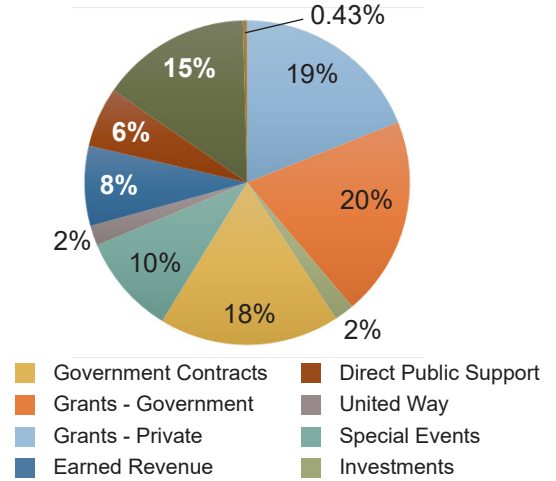
### 2023 Expenses



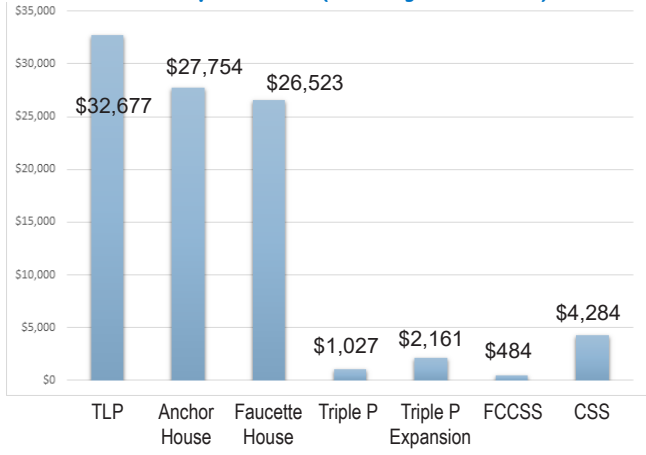
### Program Allocation



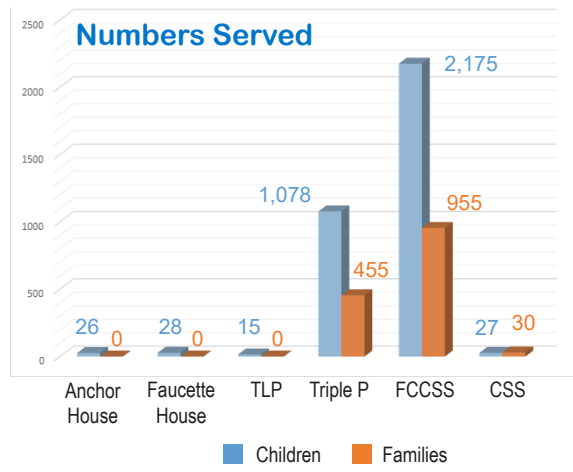
### 2023 Revenues
