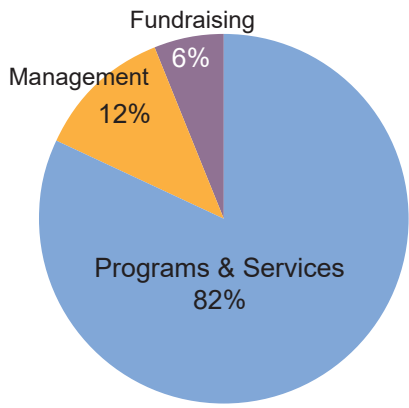
of the boys and girls in our **Faucette House** and **Anchor House** group homes were safe while in our care, attended school regularly, and had regular visits with appropriate family members.

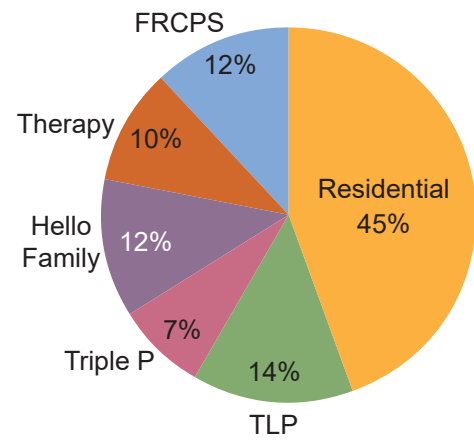
of youths in our **Transitional Living Program** improved their life skills, increased their number of reliable adult supports, and were connected to a primary care doctor.



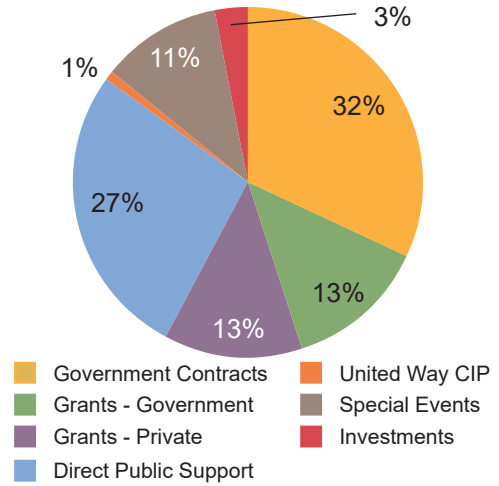
2025 Expenses



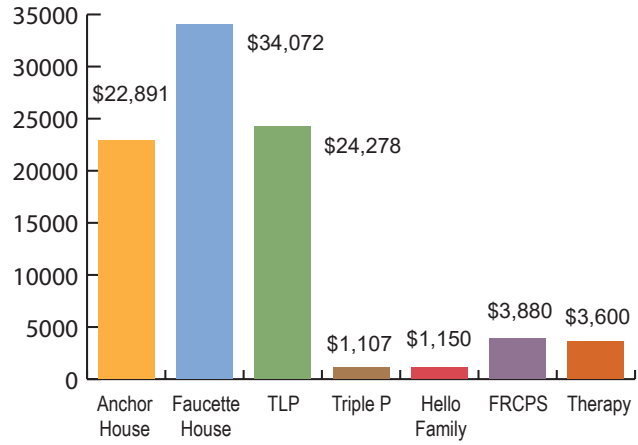
Program Allocation



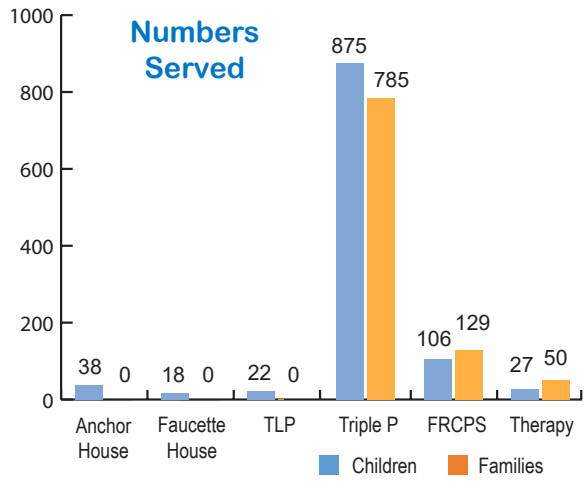
2025 Revenues
